## With Success Come Challenges.....

When Graceworks was founded 12 years ago in response to the HIV/ AIDS pandemic, the orphans and vulnerable children we were helping were very young. Most were primary school age, and therefore it was relatively inexpensive to assist them with school fees, and other basic needs.

As time has passed, and thanks in part to the excellent support, encouragement, and guidance provided by our Kenya staff, most of the children have continued to grow up and remain in school, against all odds. Many are now in secondary schools and colleges. We have also graduated some who have gone on to lead successful lives. What an awesome thing! The challenge we now face, however, is that it has become increasingly difficult to keep up with secondary and post secondary funding support for our assisted orphans and vulnerable children in Kenya.

While the cost per student per year for a primary school child in our program is only approximately \$600, the cost jumps to \$1,200 a year for a secondary school child, and for a college student, it is between \$1,800 and \$2,500 per year. At Graceworks,we believe that it would



be tragic if we were to nurture the potential in these needy children when they are younger only to dash their hopes of continuing their education when older when it could give them a better shot at a more hopeful future. **To meet this challenge, we now have a post secondary scholarship program.** 

At Graceworks, we make a promise to the orphans and vulnerable children we assist that if they persevere and stay in school, we will do our very best to help them achieve their dreams.

# **GRACEWORKS USA LOCAL OUTREACH**

In keeping with our mission of providing broad-based assistance and support to orphans, vulnerable children

and youth, Graceworks reaches out to needy children in Kinship Foster care in Orange County, California. We provide assistance with food, clothing,



shoes, school supplies and other support. Graceworks also hosts special events, especially around the holidays, and provides gifts for affected children and families in collaboration with individuals, churches, businesses, civic groups, and other charitable organizations.

#### What is Kinship Foster Care?

Kinship Foster Care is defined as "residential care of children by relatives." There are an estimated 63,000 children living in Orange County being raised by relatives. A majority of these are with grandparents who range in age

#### from 55-75, most on a fixed income. <u>How do children end up in Kinship</u> <u>Foster Care?</u>

When families experience a crisis that results in the absence or incapacity of parents, many children end up in foster care, with relatives, or with single parents who struggle to care for them. This is because we no longer have orphanages in the United States. Children can also end up in Kinship Foster Care due to issues of abuse, neglect or abandonment by their parents.
