By faith in Jesus, you can live a life of FREEDOM. This week we see how freedom comes from our relationship with the Father. Paul began his defense of the gospel in chapter 3 by showing that the law was not a contradiction to grace, but rather, it prepared us for it. Grace was our guardian and “we were in slavery under the elemental forces of the world.” (4:3b) But we have been made sons of the Father through Faith in Jesus. “So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed. (John 8:36) We have been set free by the Son and we can now call on our Father as his dearly loved children.

### **Freedom's Call... to the Father**

#### **Questions from the Text:**

1. What do we learn about our “sonship” from verses 26-27 and from the illustration given in 4:1-2?
2. In verse 28, is Paul saying that our differences and cultural distinctiveness doesn't matter? What is Paul's point? (hint see verse 26)
3. Read Gal. 4:6-7. What are the privileges of sonship which are suggested by these two verses?



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### **Applying the text:**

1. Verse 3:27 says that all Christians have “clothed themselves” with Christ. Meditate on this image. What are the implications of this metaphor? What does it tell us about being in Christ?
2. Paul imagines a child-heir of a very wealthy family. Meditate on this image. In what ways does this illustrate the condition of a person who is under the law? Do we sometimes live under the law?
3. According to verses 4:4-5, what two basic things did God send his Son Jesus to accomplish? How are the two things alike? What happens when we remember the first and forget the second?
4. How do the privileges of sonship, intimacy with the Father, and being an heir effect the way that we live as children of God?
5. In verses 4:4-7, What is the work of the Son? What is the work of the Spirit? What is the connection between the work of the Son and the work of the Spirit? How can we more deeply experience the work of the Spirit?

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
