message study guide

By faith in Jesus, we can live a life of FREEDOM. This week Paul gives us a final warning (verses 6-10)—we will reap what we sow. The fruit may be slow in coming, but it will come. We can sow to our flesh or to the Spirit. He also gives us a final invitation to live by the gospel (verses 11-18). Live in faith and trust in Christ—not in a self-done religion. Because freedom is based on Jesus work and not our own, we cannot view ourselves as better than anyone else. We can love all because he first loved us.

Read Galatians 6:1-10 & 14-18

Questions from the Text:

1. Why did Paul write what he did in verse 7? How do verses 4-6 lead into this?
2. What is the principle in verses 7-8? What examples can you think of? How is this principle misapplied?
3. Based on the context, what do you think Paul means by "doing good" (vs.9)?



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Applying the text:

1. Based on your own experiences and observations, how do we “reap” from doing good?
2. Looking at verses 12-13, How does the Gospel differ from “religion”? Where has real change in your life come from?
3. Would you agree that verses 14-15 summarize everything Paul has been saying in the letter? Why or why not? Is the cross something that we “boast” about?
4. What do you think are the “marks of Jesus” (vs.17)? Do you have any?
5. How might “doing good... to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers” give us the marks of Jesus? Where is God calling you to bear those marks?

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
