Acceptance: As members of this Life Group we seek to accept each other unconditionally as Christ does, seeking to build strong friendships rooted in Him.

Confidentiality: Everything shared in this group stays with this group. Gossip and slander are unacceptable. Like Christ, we seek the best for each other.

How to Use this Book

Each session in this booklet corresponds to the video teaching you will be watching with your Group. This format is set up for groups that meet for 1 ½ hours. You can adjust the times depending on the time limits for your group. Each week the format will be as follows...

Welcome, Introduction and Opening Prayer (10-15 Min.)

We encourage you to spend a few minutes getting to know each other and reviewing the Essentials of Life Groups.

Video (20 Min.)

Watch the video teaching for the week and write down anything that you find particularly relevant.

Discussion Questions (30-40 Min.)

We know that you might not be able to answer all of the questions. But spend some time discussing the content of the video and the connected Bible verses.

Closing Prayer (10-15 Min.)

Please take time to note any praise reports and prayer requests. Please keep these in prayer during the week.

The apostle Paul's words are packed with relevance to us today. "Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed." Paul's concern is with form! The form of the pattern of this world versus the form of faith. Paul doesn't say that we shouldn't conform. To be human is to choose patterns, models, schools of thought and influence that provide meaning in life. The question is not whether you should conform, but rather to what should you conform. In Romans 8:29 Paul says that we should conform to the likeness of Jesus - Conformity must be patterned after Jesus Christ. - that's what it means to be enrolled in God's school!

OPENING QUESTIONS

4. What lessons of God's grace and truth do you need to review and turn to again and again?

1. Read Romans 12:2. What are some of the patterns of the world we may unconsciously conform to? What practical steps can we take to unlearn them? Look at Colossians 3:16 and Hebrews 10:24-25.	
2. Read Matthew 13:3-8 and 18-23 about the parable of the four soils. Can you identify with any of the soils? What happens when we become focused on the cares of the world (verse 22)? Take another look at verse 23. What must happen before we bear fruit? How can a Life Group aid in this?	
3. Read 1 John 2:15-17 and discuss what this looks like in the life of a Christ follower.

4. Pastor Hayes read from Romans 8:29. Paul says that God conforms us to the likeness of Jesus. What does that mean?

- 1. Re-read *Romans* 12:2. Renewing means that we must do two things. First we must unlearn the corrupt ways of the world hurt, doubt, fear, lust, self-centeredness, bitterness etc. We must confess and repent and give it to God. After we have "put off" the sins of the world, then we can "put on" the mind of Christ. In this way we renew when we exchange one way of thinking for another. How do we get God's thinking in us? How would regular participation in a Life Group help to "put on" the mind of Christ?
- Dr. Ciocchi talked about how many Christians today accept the notion that faith is private. Do you see this relevant in your family life, social life, and work life? While sharing the Gospel with our words is essential, what other ways can you be a Christian witness? *Matthew 5:14-16. 2 Corinthians 5:20*

PERSONAL REFLECTION

(optional - to do or think about during the week)

- Who has been a major spiritual influence in your life and in what way? If possible, send them a thank you note.
- What does it mean to you to be "transformed by the renewing of your mind"?
- What has the World's School taught you that you have a hard time unlearning?
 What teachings from God's school do you have a hard time embracing? Pray to God and ask Him to renew your mind in these areas.

PERSONAL REFLECTION

(optional - to do or think about during the week)

Consider God's impressive track record with using unusual means to accomplish His purpose: He saved mankind by instructing Noah to build a large boat; He chose a young shepherd boy, David, to slay a mighty warrior with a rock; the walls of Jericho fell down when He instructed his people to march around the city and blow trumpets. These events and many more cannot be explained by the world. Clearly His ways are different from the world's ways – Read Isaiah 55:8-9. Why would we expect his ways with money to be any different? A rule of thumb for financial success is to spend 80% of your income, save 10%, and give 10%. Reflect this week and see how the Spirit leads you to apply this in your life.

The priesthood of all believers, to us, simply means that we are called to be God's first, and then we are to look to the responsibilities God has given to us here on earth. As a child of God our first call is to put God first in our life. We are not to find a place for God or carve in some God time, or try to squeeze Him in, we need to put Him first. We need to order our lives around his word, around prayer, around worship, around doing the work of sharing his love.

OPENING QUESTIONS

- 6. When life gets busy, what is one way you're able to re-focus your attention and priority on God?

1.Look up Psalm 104:23 and Genesis 3:19. It is apparent that we have to work in this life. In Colossians 3:23, Paul says "Whatever you do, work heartily as for the Lord and not for men." What are ways that you can work for the Lord rather than others?	
2. Laziness is a serious sin against God, who created us and gave us talents and abilities. See 2 Thessalonians 3:6-15. How can we avoid laziness, wasted time, disorder and lack of discipline in our daily lives?

3. Not all of us can sing praises or share Christ at work. What is the one thing each Christian can do while working? See 1 Thessalonians 5:17-18.	

Read 1 Peter 2:9. How does your God's call to you as part of a royal priesthood impact your life and the lives of those around you?

You are a child of the most high: made in His image. There is much work to be done. But if you want to be great, if you seek true greatness, Jesus teaches you that vou must become a servant. You must look at greatness in the way that it was done by Him. Who, as the apostle Paul put it, "Though he was God, he did not think of equality with God as something to cling to. Instead, he gave up his divine privileges; took the humble he position of a slave" [Philippians 2:6 -7a] This radical way of living, turns everything on its head.

OPENING QUESTIONS

- 1. What stood out to you in this week's video lesson? Why?
- 2. What do you think about greatness? Do you want to be great?
- 3. How does the world portray greatness?

- 4. What lessons of God's grace and truth do you need to review and turn to again and again?
- 5. What lessons are you teaching with your life?
- 6. Thinking about people in your own life, who do you admire? Why do you admire them? Is it because they wanted you to admire them or was it because they did something great and worthy of admiration?

1. In Genesis 1:26, Then God said, "Let us make man in our image, after our likeness." We may find great strength and comfort in knowing that we are made in God's image. Read Philippians 2:1-11 and discuss Christ's humility as opposed to the world's pursuits of greatness. What are some practical ways you can show humility?	
2. Read Genesis 3:1-6 to learn about what many have described as the oldest sin. Take a close look at verse 5. Was Eve trying to elevate her status? Who was she trying to be like? How can we overcome the temptation of pride?

3. Read Mark 9:33-37. Describe a time when you witnessed a simple act of service that inspired you.	

- 1. We cannot do anything to earn our salvation. Jesus paid our debt "in full" by shedding His blood on the cross. Attempting to add anything to what He has already done is blasphemy. How can we ensure our acts of service are a response to this wonderful gift and not an attempt to be good enough to earn our salvation?
- 2. As human beings, we desire approval in your life whose approval has been important to you? Why?
- 3. What have you found is the most difficult part of being a servant?

PERSONAL REFLECTION

(optional - to do or think about during the week)

The world, my flesh, seeks recognition and approval. Hidden service is good because it allows me to realize that God's approval is all I need. This week do a secret act of service. You can mow your neighbor's lawn when they are not home, or anonymously pay someone's bill, be creative. Here's the hard part, tell no one! Do it without the possibility that anyone other than God will know what you did.

1. Read 1 Corinthians 6:12-20. How does God's word help us think about the body? Who is the body meant for? Is your body your own? Why are sexual sins so damaging? Verses 19-20 talk about the fact that we have been bought at a price. Because of that, we are to honor God with our bodies. Why is this both freeing and demanding?

2. How we relate to each other is more about love than about sex. Sex is a great gift to express love, within marriage. When loving others is our priority, we honor God and each other. Read 1 Corinthians 13 out loud in your group. Now reread verses 4-7 silently and insert your name instead of the word love. Discuss the thoughts and lessons that come to mind as you inserted your name in the verses. 3. Reread 1 Corinthians 13:11. This verse describes the opposite of love. How are childish ways the opposite of love? How can we love better as we mature and put childish ways behind us?	

- 1. What does fleeing from sexual immorality look like in our culture? How should we react to TV or popular music with sexually explicit content? How does it affect us?
- 2. Rehearse in your group how you should speak to your child regarding sexuality? Should you sermonize? What's your tone? How does the gospel predominate in any conversation regarding sexuality?
- 3. Google search sexual addiction or jump on www.cdc.gov. How does this information inform our decisions regarding sexuality?
- 4. Has your view of sexuality changed as our culture has become more open, permissive and accepting of sex outside of marriage?

PERSONAL REFLECTION

(optional - to do or think about during the week)

In an adult confirmation class, the Pastor was teaching on the sixth commandment. He told a story about how we can teach our pets/dogs not to make messes in the house. If we can teach something so basic to an animal that doesn't even speak our language, we certainly can teach our children about God's principles of sexual relationships and to consider our bodies as God's temple.

4. Read Romans 3:20-31 – Paul states that righteousness is given through faith and that faith is found in Jesus alone. Despite what the world says, faith in Jesus Christ is the only way to exist as we ought to be and as we were created to be. Do you find it easy or difficult to hold on to this truth? In what ways does the world's school try convince us otherwise? Discuss		

- 1. How are you personally able to keep your faith in Christ and His word when times are difficult, chaotic or traumatic?
- 2. Pastor Mike used the analogy that life is like being in the middle of the ocean. If you have faith in yourself, or in an anchor, shark, or anything other than a life saving device you will drown. We live in a world that says there are many different faiths. Discuss this ocean analogy in your group. How can we show people that only faith in Jesus will save them?

PERSONAL REFLECTION

(optional - to do or think about during the week)

Hebrews 11-12:2 is often called the faith chapter. Read this to give you confidence that God is trustworthy, all His promises have been kept, and without fear we can invite the Holy Spirit to influence us as shining lights in the world, not of the world.

Now faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see. This is what the ancients were commended for. By faith we understand that the universe was formed at God's command, so that what is seen was not made out of what was visible.

Hebrews 11:1-3 NIV

LEADER NOTES

On all Discussion Questions: Pick one of the opening questions to discuss with your group. Beginning groups might want to answer all of them. Groups that want to go deeper may want to jump straight to the Influence of The Word questions and deeper questions.

As you work through the questions with your group, watch your time and be sure to discuss some or all of the Bible questions section.

Session 1:

Opening Questions:

Pick one question to discuss with your group.

Influence of The Word - suggested answers:

Answer as many as you have time for.

- 1. The next five lessons will talk about the world's patterns on money, work, greatness, sex and faith. Practically speaking, unlearning the lessons of the world first involves being aware of their influence on us. Also, spending more time being influenced by God helps us to conform to God and his Word. Worship, Life Groups (Hebrews 10:24-25), sharing Christ, reading/studying the Bible (see Col 3:16) all contribute to unlearning the world's lessons.
- 2. Let people talk about the soils. If we focus on the cares of this world we don't bear fruit. If we hear the Word and understand it, that will produce fruit in our lives, for the benefit of ourselves and others. A Life Group provides healthy soil so we can grow, thrive and produce fruit!
- 3. As Christians, we continually grow by seeking God's will instead of our own. Knowing that the world and its desires will pass away helps us to realize that our cravings, lusts, and boastings will never really fulfill us.
- 4. Ultimately when Jesus comes again we will conform to Jesus' likeness in that just as he has been raised from the dead so too will we. However, here and now, through God's Word we grow and mature and become more like Christ thinking and acting like Him and His Word.

Deeper Questions:

- 1. Getting God's thinking into us happens by coming to church to worship, reading the Word daily, talking about the Word with others and living out that Word in our lives. Studying the Word with other believers and receiving encouragement and challenge from them helps us mature as believers.
- 2. Living an upright and moral life, loving your family, acts of service, giving generously to church and other organizations are all ways to let your faith be known in the World. We are God's ambassadors and he has chosen to change the World through us, his people.

Session 2:

Opening Questions:

Pick one question to discuss with your group.

Influence of The Word - suggested answers:

- 1. Stewardship is managing all of God's creation and all that he has entrusted to us. We are managing His possessions, not ours.
- 2. God wants us to give generously. It is good for our hearts to give. Jesus cares about our hearts.
- 3. When we seek the kingdom of God first, everything else falls in to place. The greatest riches man can experience is the presence of Christ with us forever.

Deeper Questions:

- 1. Giving to God first demonstrates where are our priorities are. It helps our hearts to give to Him first.
- 2. Open ended question.

Session 3:

Opening Questions:

Pick one question to discuss with your group.

Influence of The Word - suggested answers:

- 1. It is important to remember that we can serve God by serving others. Our example of being a faithful worker testifies to who God is.
- 2. Realizing that God desires us to work hard is the first step. Also, we do well to remember that God has redeemed and renews us when we fail at this.
- Pray and give thanks to God.

Deeper Questions:

On the one hand it should remind us that we are part of God's great work in redeeming humanity. On the other hand, it moves us beyond ourselves to bringing the light of Jesus to those in darkness.

Session 4:

Opening Questions:

Pick one question to discuss with your group.

Influence of The Word - suggested answers:

- 1. Christ's humility means salvation for us. Discuss ways that you can seek the best for others at home, at work, in your neighborhood, etc.
- 2. Eve was trying to be like God, pursuing a greatness that she could never attain. Overcoming pride comes with a humility that sees how sinful we are and how gracious our Lord is in Jesus Christ. From there we can do truly great things by serving others.
- 3. Children were regarded as nothing in ancient times, mere property really. The fact that Jesus welcomed them and elevated their status shows a true servant's heart. Think of a time when someone else has done something so counter-cultural yet so loving and servant oriented. We may think of people like Mother Theresa and Father Damien (lepers).

Deeper Questions:

- 1. Always praying and being aware of our thoughts and motives. This may be one of the hardest things for a Christian. Each week we have a chance to confess our sins and assess ourselves before God in Worship.
- 2. Open ended.
- 3. Most will talk about complete selflessness. This is completely counter-cultural.

Session 5:

Opening Questions:

Pick one question to discuss with your group.

Influence of The Word - suggested answers:

- 1. Our bodies are meant for God. They are part of the body of Christ. Christ purchased them with his blood. When we sin sexually we sin against Christ, ourselves, the other person and the Holy Spirit that lives within us. Because we have been bought, we are free from all the sexual sins we have committed. This command to honor God with our bodies is extremely challenging as we still live in a broken and sinful state.
- 2. This question is good for focusing on the love side of honoring each other, which includes the body.
- 3. Childish ways only seek self. Sometimes we do this with sex, making it only about ourselves. Thinking about other's needs first happens as we mature as believers.

Deeper Questions:

- 1. Different reactions may come from people. You might want to discuss finding a good balance between keeping away from the bad things in culture yet still being aware of the culture.
- 2. Important to discuss that parents need to be talking about God's design for sex. This should happen often throughout a child's life.

- 3. Sexual sins, addictions and diseases have brought much damage to many lives. This reality calls for us to talk about and deal with these issues candidly and directly.
- 4. It is important for us to realize how much our culture has affected us and to discuss how we might maintain God's design for sex.

Session 6:

Since it's week 6 and the group should hopefully feel pretty comfortable, the group leader may consider opening the group up to share their testimony - how they came to have faith. Who in their life helped lead them to their faith? Even mature Christians struggle with their faith. What "hang-ups" or "questions" do you sometimes get stuck on and have you consulted with anyone to help reconcile those questions?

Opening Questions:

Pick one question to discuss with your group.

Influence of The Word - suggested answers:

- 1. Ephesians reminds us that even faith/belief is a gift.
- 2. Increased trust in Jesus allows us to weather the storms of life more readily and be more bold as a witness for Him.
- 3. True faith rests in Jesus. In Jesus we find our true identity. The world tells us to place our faith in ourselves, our possessions, other people, the way people view us. etc.
- 4. The world would have us think that faith in anything is fine just as long as you have faith. The Bible is very clear; faith in Jesus is the only saving faith.

Deeper Questions:

- 1. Open ended
- 2. Living lives that reflect faith in Jesus speaks volumes to a world of people searching for truth.
